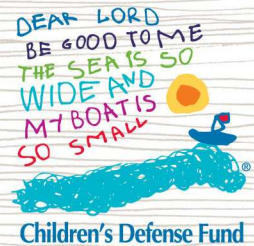

**All Children Need Health Coverage that is Affordable, Comprehensive, and Simple.**

### Health Coverage for Idaho's Children:

- 49,000 children are uninsured (11.3% of all children). \*
- 134,786 children are enrolled in Medicaid. \*\*
- 43,526 children are enrolled in the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). \*\*\*

### How affordable is health coverage for Idaho's children? †

- CHIP eligibility is up to 185 percent of poverty (\$40,793 for a family of four).
- Medicaid eligibility is 133 percent of poverty (\$29,327).

### How simple are enrollment procedures in CHIP and Medicaid for Idaho's children?

- Simplification procedures:
  - 12 month continuous eligibility
  - Administrative verification of income
  - No face-to-face interview
  - No asset test
  - Joint application
- Barriers that remain:
  - 6 month waiting period
  - No presumptive eligibility—which forces children to wait until their application is processed before they can see a doctor
