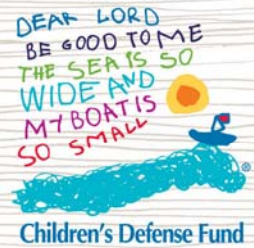

All Children Need Health Coverage that is Affordable, Comprehensive, and Simple.

Health Coverage for North Carolina's Children:

- 290,000 children are uninsured (12.2% of all children). *
- 851,962 children are enrolled in Medicaid. **
- 251,653 children are enrolled in the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). ***

How affordable is health coverage for North Carolina's children? †

- CHIP eligibility is up to 200 percent of poverty (\$44,100 for a family of four).
- Medicaid eligibility is 200 percent of poverty for children 0-5, and 100 percent of poverty (\$22,050) for children 6-19.

How simple are enrollment procedures in CHIP and Medicaid for North Carolina's children?

- Simplification procedures:
 - 12-month continuous eligibility
 - No face-to-face interview
 - No waiting period
 - No asset test
 - Joint application
- Barriers that remain:
 - No presumptive eligibility—which forces children to wait until their application is processed before they can see a doctor
 - No administrative verification of income—the state requires parents to provide proof of income before a child can get health coverage
