



All Children Need Health Coverage that is Affordable, Comprehensive, and Simple.

Health Coverage for Tennessee's Children:

- 134,000 children uninsured (8.6% of all children). *
- 679,425 children are enrolled in Medicaid. **
- 63,619 children are enrolled in the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). ***

How affordable is health coverage for Tennessee's children? †

- CHIP eligibility is up to 250 percent of poverty (\$55,125 for a family of four).
- Medicaid eligibility is 185 percent of poverty for children 0-1 (\$40,793), 133 percent of poverty (\$29,327) for children 1-5, and 100 percent of poverty (\$22,050) for children 6-19.

How simple are enrollment procedures in CHIP and Medicaid for Tennessee's children?

- Simplification procedures:
 - 12-month continuous eligibility for children in CHIP
 - No face-to-face interview for children in CHIP
 - Administrative verification of income for children in CHIP
 - No asset test
- Barriers that remain:
 - Face-to-face interview for children in Medicaid
 - No 12-month continuous eligibility for children in Medicaid
 - No joint application
 - No presumptive eligibility—which forces children to wait until their application is processed before they can see a doctor
 - No administrative verification of income for children in Medicaid—the state requires parents to provide proof of income before a child can get health coverage
 - 3 month waiting period
