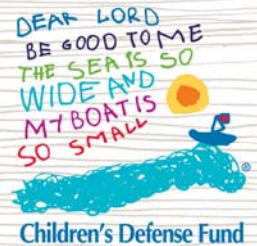

Health Coverage for All Children: Utah

All Children Need Health Coverage that is Affordable, Comprehensive, and Simple.

Health Coverage for Utah's Children:

- 108,000 children are uninsured (12.1% of all children).*
- 173,390 children are enrolled in Medicaid.**
- 51,092 children are enrolled in the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP).***

How affordable is health coverage for Utah's children?†

- CHIP eligibility is up to 200 percent of poverty (\$44,100 for a family of four).
- Medicaid eligibility is 133 percent of poverty (\$29,327) for children 0-5, and 100 percent of poverty (\$22,050) for children 6-19.

How simple are enrollment procedures in CHIP and Medicaid for Utah's children?

- Simplification procedures:
 - 12-month continuous eligibility for children in CHIP
 - No face-to-face interview
 - Joint Application
- Barriers that remain:
 - No 12-month continuous eligibility for children in Medicaid
 - Asset test of \$3,025 for children over 6 in Medicaid
 - No administrative verification of income at enrollment—the state requires parents to provide proof of income before a child can get health coverage
 - No presumptive eligibility—which forces children to wait until their application is processed before they can see a doctor
 - 90 day waiting period
