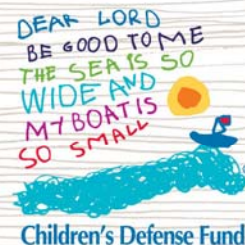

All Children Need Health Coverage that is Affordable, Comprehensive, and Simple.

Health Coverage for Virginia's Children:

- 188,000 children are uninsured (9.7% of all children).*
- 463,221 children are enrolled in Medicaid.**
- 155,289 children are enrolled in the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP).***

How affordable is health coverage for Virginia's children? †

- CHIP eligibility is up to 200 percent of poverty (\$44,100 for a family of four).
- Medicaid eligibility is 133 percent of poverty (\$29,327).

How simple are enrollment procedures in CHIP and Medicaid for Virginia's children?

- Simplification procedures:
 - 12-month continuous eligibility for children in CHIP
 - No face-to-face interview
 - No asset test
 - Joint application
- Barriers that remain:
 - 4-month waiting period
 - No 12-month continuous eligibility for children in Medicaid
 - No presumptive eligibility—which forces children to wait until their application is processed before they can see a doctor
 - No administrative verification of income—the state requires parents to provide proof of income before a child can get health coverage
