1,669,866 children live in Arizona:
 37,342 are Asian/Pacific Islander, non-Hispanic
 39,657 are two or more races, non-Hispanic
 67,744 are Black, non-Hispanic
 87,460 are American Indian/Alaska Native, non-Hispanic
 701,723 are Hispanic
 735,940 are White, non-Hispanic

In Arizona:

A child is born into poverty every 23 minutes.
 A child is abused or neglected every 2 hours.
 A child dies before his or her first birthday every 13 hours.
 A child or teen is killed by gunfire every 4 days.

Arizona Ranks:*

12th among states in percent of babies born at low birthweight.
 Best states are Alaska, Oregon, and Washington; worst state is Mississippi
 27th among states in its infant mortality rate.
 Best state is Utah; worst is the District of Columbia
 50th among states in per pupil expenditures.
 Best state is New Jersey; worst state is Utah
 [*1st represents the best state for children and 51st represents the worst state for children in the country]
