Children's Defense Fund—California (CDF-CA) seeks Los Angeles-based individuals with lived experience in the foster care system to join the **Radical Imagination Fellowship**. The fellowship will convene a team of confident rising leaders prepared to collaboratively activate their radical imagination to ensure a better now and future for foster care-impacted youth in Los Angeles.

Individuals selected to join the fellowship will collaborate with CDF-CA staff, peers, and community partners to achieve the following:

- 1. Co-produce CDF-CA's Radical Imagination Fellowship podcast
- 2. Lead Story Map Workshops supporting Foster Care-Impacted Youth and Transition-Age Youth (TAY) in navigating their K-12 academic journey
- Co-produce CDF-CA's 2025 Child Watch, CDF-CA's annual child advocacy convening

Schedule and Reporting

Fellows will report directly to CDF-CA's senior manager of youth development. **The fellowship will run weekly from March 17–September 30, 2025**. Schedules will be determined based on selected applicants' availability.

Responsibilities

- **Co-produce a three-episode podcast** focused on issues impacting foster care-impacted youth and transition-age youth.
- Co-produce Child Watch, CDF-CA's annual child advocacy event.
- Co-lead story map workshops, helping amplify youth voices through storytelling.
- **Support research and data analysis** on issues affecting transition-age youth (TAY) and foster care-impacted youth.
- Attend at least three *CDF Freedom Schools* events to engage with youth and community leaders.
- Participate in and lead collaborative discussions with peers, CDF-CA staff, youth, and community partners.
- Complete weekly program impact evaluations, and a pre/post-program evaluation.

Eligibility Requirements

- Be between the ages of 18–25 and currently or formerly impacted by the foster care system.
- **∉** Available for up to 10 hours per week from March–September 2025.
- Commit to full participation in weekly workshops and meetings from March– September 2025.
- ∉ Available to participate virtually and in-person.

- ✓ Visionary and creative thinker, ready to explore bold ideas and drive social transformation for transition-age youth (TAY) and foster care-impacted youth.
- ∉ Possess a strong interest in podcast production and on-air hosting.
- ∉ Comfortable with public speaking and enthusiastic about working in group settings.
- ∉ Genuine curiosity about data and how it can be used to create change.

- ∉ Familiar with **New Media tools**, including TikTok, Facebook, Instagram, Threads, BlueSky, and Twitch.
