# Health Coverage for All Children: Illinois

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### All Children Need Health Coverage that is Affordable, Comprehensive, and Simple.

#### **Health Coverage for Illinois' Children:**

- 259,000 children are uninsured (7.7% of all children).
- 1,454,385 children are enrolled in Medicaid.
- 329,104 children are enrolled in the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). \*\*\*

# How affordable is health coverage for Illinois' children? †

- CHIP eligibility is up to 200 percent of poverty (\$44,700 for a family of four), and Illinois has a state-funded expansion for all children above that income level.
- Medicaid eligibility is 133 percent of poverty (\$29,726) for children 0-5, 100 percent of poverty (22,350) for children 6-19.

## How simple are enrollment procedures in CHIP and Medicaid for Illinois' children?

- Simplification procedures:
  - 12-month continuous eligibility
  - No asset test
  - No face-to-face interview
  - Presumptive eligibility so children do not have to wait for their application to be processed before seeing a doctor
  - Joint application
  - Administrative verification of income at renewal
- Barriers that remain:
  - 12-month waiting period
  - No administrative verification of income at enrollment—the state requires parents to provide proof of income before a child can get health coverage
