Health Coverage for All Children: Massachusetts



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All Children Need Health Coverage that is Affordable, Comprehensive, and Simple.

Health Coverage for Massachusetts' Children:

- 49,000 children are uninsured (3.2% of all children).
- 530,412 children are enrolled in Medicaid.
- 142,279 children are enrolled in the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP).***

How affordable is health coverage for Massachusetts' children?

- CHIP eligibility is up to 300 percent of poverty (\$67,050 for a family of four). Massachusetts has a state-funded expansion for all children.
- Medicaid eligibility is up to 185 percent of poverty (\$41,348) for children 0-1, 133 percent of poverty (\$29,726) for children 1-5 and 114 percent of poverty (25,479) children 6-19.

How simple are enrollment procedures in CHIP and Medicaid for Massachusetts' children?

- Good for children:
 - Presumptive Eligibility
 - No face-to-face interview
 - No asset test
 - Joint application
- NOT good for children:
 - No 12-month continuous eligibility
 - 6 month waiting period in CHIP program for children between 200-300 percent of poverty
 - No administrative verification of income—the state requires parents to provide proof of income before a child can get health coverage

Do children in Massachusetts' CHIP program receive the same comprehensive benefits as children in Medicaid?

Yes. Massachusetts provides children in its CHIP program the same comprehensive health and mental health coverage (through the Early and Periodic Screening Diagnostic and Treatment (EPSDT) benefit) that all children in Medicaid receive.
