Use these pages as living documents—translate, remix, and brand them for your context. Pair every invitation with one clear next step and a personal follow-up. As you share back stories and metrics with The Children's Defense Fund, your local witness strengthens a national movement for children.



Sample Email Templates

Copy-ready invites for every audience.

The sample email templates are ready-made drafts leaders can copy, paste, and adapt to quickly begin outreach. They save time and ensure that messaging about the Children's Sabbath is consistent, clear, and aligned with CDF's national vision.

Each email is written for a specific audience:

- Congregations: Invite local congregations to participate in the Children's Sabbath.
- Denominational Leaders: Ask denominational leaders (bishops, moderators, regional leaders, etc.) to encourage participation across their whole denomination.
- Partner Organizations: Extend the invitation to justice-minded organizations beyond congregations (e.g., nonprofits, advocacy coalitions, community groups).


How Leaders Should Use This Section

- Customize, Customize; Insert names, dates, and local details to make each message personal.
- Attach the Right Packet: Always include the corresponding engagement packet so recipients have practical next steps.
- Use these templates to reach out through email lists, denominational channels, and partner networks.
- After sending, leaders should call or meet with key contacts to deepen the invitation and build

Congregations: Invite local congregations to participate in the Children's Sabbath.





Denominational Leaders: Ask denominational leaders (bishops, moderators, regional leaders, etc.) to encourage participation across their whole denomination.





Sample Bulletin / Newsletter Blurbs

Short announcement for broad visibility.

The bulletin/newsletter blurb is a short announcement written for quick, wide distribution. It is designed to be placed in a church bulletin, worship insert, denominational newsletter, community announcement board, or email update. Its purpose is to spread awareness of the Children's Sabbath and invite participation in a way that is brief, clear, and inspiring.



Social Media Posts & Tools

Go LIVE: lift voices, invite action.



Purpose

Instagram Live is an important way to share stories and generate excitement about the National Observance of Children's Sabbaths. Hosting short live interviews with past or current participants brings visibility to the impact of Children's Sabbaths, energizes supporters, and raises awareness among broader audiences. These conversations also invite viewers into action—joining the observance, sharing resources, and supporting CDF's ongoing work.

Series Plan

Plan three short interviews (about 30 minutes each). Spread them out to build momentum leading up to Children's Sabbaths weekend.

Prepare Interview Questions

Use guiding questions to keep the conversation focused and inspiring. For example:

- When did you first decide to take part in Children's Defense Fund's *National Observance of Children's Sabbaths*?
- What is your message to churches, faith communities, or faith-based organizations considering participation?
- What has been the most exciting or meaningful part of planning or participating in Children's Sabbaths?

Promote the Live Events

Share graphics, posts, and stories on social media a few days before each session. Always include:

- Date and time of the Instagram Live
- Who will be interviewed
- Why it matters (impact of Children's Sabbaths)
- Link for more info and resources (The link can be made available through your Instagram page's bio or stories.)

Go LIVE: lift voices, invite action.



Host & Engage

- Welcome viewers warmly and introduce your guest.
- Ask the prepared questions, while allowing for authentic conversation.
- Encourage viewers to drop comments, questions, or stories in the chat.

Include Calls to Action During each interview, remind participants:


- Resources are available through the Children's Sabbaths manual (provide link).
- Support CDF's work by:
 - Becoming a monthly donor
 - o Making a one-time gift
 - Becoming a sponsor
 - o Exploring other giving opportunities through the link in bio
 - Signing up for email updates
 - Following CDF on all social media platforms

After the LIVE!

- Save the recording to your Instagram profile so people can watch later.
- Share clips or quotes across other social platforms.
- Thank the guest publicly and tag them to extend reach.

Key Takeaway

An Instagram Live series personalizes the Children's Sabbaths movement, making it visible in real time. It highlights lived experiences, inspires new participation, and strengthens the collective witness for justice on behalf of children.

Follow up with personal calls or meetings to deepen engagement. Collect and share stories, photos, and commitments with the Children's Defense Fund.
